The Mid-Atlantic District Fall Convention was again held in York, PA on September 27-29 at the York Central Middle School and marked the 26th anniversary of the champ's association. The MADAQC Chorus performance on the Saturday night Show of Champions was incredibly well sung, requiring just a couple of run-throughs prior. Attending during the weekend were <u>36</u> individual M-AD quartet champs representing <u>36</u> different championship foursomes spanning 6 decades ... from the Friends of Yesterday (1974) with lead Dick Bentz to Smoke Ring (2024).

Secret Best Friends performed "Nancy (With the Laughing Face)", "I Could Write a Book", "Then I'll Be Tired of You", and "O Pato (The Duck)" to earn 3,084 points and an overall score of 85.7%. This after their fantastic 8th place finish at the BHS International Contest in Cleveland this past summer.

Quartet Contest Semi-Finals



The Friday Quartet Semifinals began at 5:30 after a short delay. M-AD President Steve Kirsch (left) kicked off the weekend with some important remarks then introduced the presenter, M-AD Executive VP Steve Skolnick, for the semifinal quartet round. The judging panel included Rob Hopkins (Panel Chair); Rob Arnold (Administrative Judge); Anthony Bartholomew, Joe Cerutti, and Steve Tramack (Musicality); Steve Curulla, Mo Field, and Robert Ross (Performance), and



DC Nash, **Renee Tramack**, and **John Ward** (Singing). VP-Contests & Judging was **Rafi Hasib**.

The mic-testers were to be **Smoke Ring (2024 M-AD Quartet Champs** and **9**th **Place BHS Finalists)**, but due to some transportation challenges from New York City they arrived a bit later, and a practice judge's quartet was quickly formed for the task. However, Smoke Ring was able to serve as the mic-coolers to the delight of the audience.

Chorus Contest



The Chorus contest started promptly at 9:00 am. **Debbie Kirsch**, M-AD Director of Education (and better half of **Steve**), served as the presenter. The mic-tester chorus was the **MAD All Voices Chorus** under the direction of **Joe Cerutti**. There were <u>17</u> choruses competing this year with <u>7</u> directed by MADAQC members: **Vincent Sandroni** (Parkside Harmony), **Will Downey** (East Coast Sound), **Jeff Glemboski** (Long Island Sound), **Mike Wallen** (The Virginians), **Neil "Pookie" Dingle** (Keystone Capital Chorus), **Kevin King** (Chorus of the Chesapeake), **Joe Servidio Jr.** (The Dapper Dans of Harmony).

While we waited for the contest results the Mid-Atlantic District Hall of Honor (HoH) members lined up on the stage for the induction ceremony for the district's highest and most prestigious award. Note that counting this year's recipients, <u>25</u> MADAQC champs have been inducted into the HoH since it was established in 1986. John Santora, the 2024 HOH Selection Committee Chair, and three committee members, Doug Brown, Joe Cerutti, and Jay Butterfield, read the impressive biographies and contributions by this year's recipients, Larry Bomback, Tony Colosimo, and Sean Devine who received standing ovations by the district audience. The Hall of Honor has become a family affair with inductees Tony and dad Bill Colosimo, Kevin and dad Freddie King, Stephanie Brictson and dad Chuck Lower, Ann Bureau and husband Ig Jakovac, Mike and dad Mitch Frances, and Bob Disney and

As usual, **Rick Taylor** wore several hats this weekend ... as a quartet man, chorus singer, and promoter. 4th Place – Sirens of Gotham (Hell's Kitchen, NY)

5th Place - East Coast Sound (Caldwell, NJ) Under the direction of **Will Downey**

6th Place – True North Chorus (Greater Delaware, DE)

During the afternoon there were two interesting and well-attended events: a **Tag Session** hosted by the **True North Chorus** in the lobby to raise funds for barbershop youth and a **Chorus Medalists Q&A Panel** in the main auditorium featuring artistic directors **Anna Chelak** (Gotham), **Vincent Sandroni** (Parkside Harmony), and **Joe Cerutti** (Alexandria Harmonizers).

Steve Kirsch emceed the Quartet Finals and part of the Show of Champions that featured top choruses, Secret Best Friend, and Gimme Four. Tony Colosimo was on hand representing First Take who earned a 2nd Place silver medal in Cleveland, and Joe Cerutti discussed the society's The Big Leap Program for chapter development and advancement.





The **Gotham Chorus** performed as the 3rd Place International Medalist chorus and **Parkside Harmony** gave a rousing set as our new chorus champions, their 7th win. Then singing their swan song set as our outgoing quartet champs, **Smoke Ring** again wowed the audience with their artistic flavor, savvy style, and locked sound.

We were extraordinarily well prepared and our longtime honorary director, Kevin King, only needed to do a couple of run throughs before we were ready. We took the stage, and the audience gave us a rousing applause. KJ McAleesejergins, baritone of our 2023 International Quartet Champions, Midtown, served as our emcee. He commented on the many quartet champs attending the convention and their continuing roles in supporting the district and read the names of the foursomes they represented. The audience gave each a clap in cadence. KJ also gave recognition for the 25th anniversary of Casino with Scott, Mike W., and Mike K. present, the 50th anniversary of the Reign Beaus' End though no surviving members were present, and a special acknowledgement to the very dapper Dick Bentz representing the Friends of Yesterday in their 51st year.

This year was also the 50th anniversary of the **Regents** (Joe Mazzone (L), Hal Kauffman (bs), Ron Knickerbocker (Br), and Harry Williamson (T), our 1974 International Quartet Champions. Surviving member Ron is doing well but was unable to attend.

Rafi Hasib and Rob Arnold gave the late-night eval instructions and then announced the contest results. Smoke Ring stood at the ready to award the blue pins as Steve Kirsch brought out the trophy. Quartet results in reverse order:

This was an incredibly tight quartet competition between the second and third place quartets who were separated by just 1 point and both singing at A+ levels. **Secret Best Friends** came out on top by a considerable margin and were crowned **2025 M-AD Quartet Champions** to the roars and standing ovation by the judges and the entire audience. They were awarded the traveling **MADAQC/Oriole Four**

Trophy and 1st Place lapel pins. MADAQC champion badges will be presented later along with individual plaques from the district.









Kevin King then directed the **MADAQC Chorus** in singing our traditional song of celebration and congratulations, "This is the Moment" (arranged by Freddie King), as Secret Best Friends stood arm-in-arm, filled with pride, and humbly accepting the admiration from their now fellow champions. Kevin then led the entire audience in "Keep the Whole World Singing" ... bringing to a close another fantastic barbershop convention in the absolute hottest district in the entire Barbershop Harmony Society.

Quartet Champions' Reception

Immediately following the close of the convention, we moved to the backstage area where **Tom** and **Donna Halley** had set up the **Quartet Champions' Reception**. **Steve White** led the toast in welcoming **Secret Best Friends** into our association, recognized their hard work, 8th place international finish in Cleveland, and their momentous achievement as new champions. **Smoke Ring** offered very personal and heartfelt congratulations and continued the tradition of offering a legacy gift. **Mike Kelly** took photos.
